PASTORAL PONDERINGS

Dear Friends in Two Rock and Tomales,

At a joint meeting of the sessions of Tomales and Two Rock Valley Presbyterian Churches on June 22, I announced to our elders my intent to retire. The following day, I mailed out letters to many of you, so that everyone would be informed of my plans. Here is that communication, a bit modified:

This letter is to let you know that, at last night's session meeting, I announced my plan to retire as pastor of Two Rock Valley and Tomales Presbyterian Churches, effective October 1, 2021.

When I arrived as your pastor on June 13, 2006, I was just 50 years of age and full of energy. Fifteen years later, I am almost 66, and in September, I will have reached my full retirement age. Given my heart-related health issues, the medication I need to take, and the fatigue that often slows me down, I have decided not to continue working but to step down this fall.

As I look back on the fifteen years of ministry that we have shared, I am filled with deep gratitude to each one of you. I am thankful for our faithful worship of God, for baptisms, weddings, memorial services, and celebrating two 150th anniversaries, plus our

60th anniversary of being yoked congregations. I have cherished our fellowship: coffee hour worship, potlucks, getting together in small groups, and visiting you in your homes. I have enjoyed our education groups adult watching our children mature in Sunday school. It has been exciting to see the renovations of our buildings and grounds, both for our Sesquicentennials and recently. I have loved our community events and fundraisers and how we are reaching out more deliberately in mission and service. And I am very grateful that we have come through fifteen months of pandemic restrictions and are back to in-person worship and back to all the other things we do as churches of Jesus Christ.

For the next three month, I will continue to serve wholeheartedly as your pastor and fulfill all my usual tasks. At the same time, our two sessions, with guidance from our Presbytery of the Redwoods, will identify and interview candidates for the position of temporary pastor. Three months should be enough time to find a good person who will lead our churches in the next stage of ministry. And we will have three months to celebrate our time together and to anticipate in hope what the Holy Spirit will unfold for the churches in Two Rock and Tomales.

Since June 22, the Tomales session has elected elder Sharon Knudsen,

clerk of the Tomales session, and elder Amanda Graves to be on the Pastor Nominating Temporary Committee (TPNC); and the Two Rock session chose elder David Coe, clerk of the Two Rock session, and elder Kathy Stroke to be on that same TPNC. These four elders will work closely with the Rev. Eric Beene, Mission Presbyter of our Presbytery of the Redwoods, to identify three or four candidates who could serve for about 18 months as temporary pastor. The TPNC will interview each of them, check up on their backgrounds and references, listen to sermons, and eventually select one of the candidates as the temporary pastor of Tomales and Two Rock Valley Presbyterian Churches. The hope is that this person would start on or about October 1, 2021.

In the meantime, we will keep worshipping together, make plans for our fall events and fundraiser, and follow Christ's call to care for one another and for our communities. And we will give thanks that our gracious and loving God guides us in all that we do, and keeps us ever in God's care.

© After 15 months of distance learning, zoom-learning, and hybrid-learning, celebrating the end of the school year held special meaning 2021!

At Two Rock Church, we honored our students on June 27. Our eight children and youth were Mary Briggs, Collin and Luke McClelland, Hunter Patterson, Bristol Parisian, and Elizabeth, Nathan and Natalie Young. They will be in various grades next year from preschool to high school, and one-year-old Benjamin Young will be cared for at home.

Congratulations to all of our students and parents for adjusting to challenging circumstances, for enduring when internet connections were spotty, and for persevering when it was difficult to concentrate on hour after hour of zoom instructions. You have made it through this unprecedented year, and each of you has done well! We pray that this coming school year, you will all be back for good in your classrooms, with your teachers and school friends!

© In August of last year, a group of people from both our congregations started a zoom reading group. We were eager to talk about social issues in our society, particularly the issue of racial justice that was being debated in the aftermath of the killing of George Floyd on May 25, 2020, Memorial Day.

We read about the struggles and **experiences of African Americans** in the writings of Austin Channing Brown, Ibrahim X. Kendi, and Isabel Wilkerson.

We also discussed Jeanine Cummins' *American Dirt* and the challenges faced by immigrants that come to the USA from Central America.

In May and June, we focused on **Biblical history**, specifically on the time period between the writing of

the last books in the Old Testament (Ezra, Nehemiah, and Daniel) and the writings of the New Testament. Kip Spragens provided us with abstract of some helpful history books, we shared maps and charts, and we learned about people, events, and movements that influenced the history of Judah, Galilee, Syria, and Palestine.

Currently, our reading group is on summer break until **Monday**, **August 2nd.** We will reconvene that afternoon, decide whether to meet in person or on zoom, and determine what to read and discuss in August and September.

PROPERTY & FINANCE

Sunday, June 20th, was the first time in 15 months that the Two Rock congregation worshipped in its sanctuary. Everyone was happy to leave zoom services behind and gather in person at the church! We even had coffee hour after the service, with individually wrapped cookies and other snacks, and we talked with one another through our masks. It was great!

And then the news came around 5 pm that there was a fire near the church. It turned out to be a vehicle fire, right below Two Rock Church on Bodega Avenue!





A pickup truck was pulling a motorhome, and apparently the chain between the two vehicles was dragging, heating up on the asphalt, and causing sparks to fly. And then the propane tank caught fire, and both the truck and the motorhome were soon engulfed in flames.

Saill White took these photos of the burning vehicles right after she called 911; we are so grateful that she noticed this incident and responded immediately! By that time, the propane tank was burning so hot that it exploded and parts of it flew into the Mahrt ranch across Springhill Road and started two grass fires. One big section of that propane tank ended up in the Two Rock cemetery, though nothing caught fire there. One can only imagine the amount of heat that turned that propane tank into such a forceful projectile.

How fortunate that we are located so close to the Two Rock Volunteer Fire Department and the Two Rock Coast Guard Base with its firefighting unit. Thanks to their prompt intervention and thanks to the fast action of Ingrid Mahrt's ranch workers, the fire was extinguished before it reached any structures.

In these two final photos you can see what was left of the pickup truck and the motorhome: both were total losses.

Thanks be to God that nothing worse happened; no one was hurt

and no structures caught fire. Thanks be to God for alert neighbors like Saill, for rapidly responding fire fighters, for quick-acting ranch workers, and for everyone else who helped extinguish this vehicle fire and the two grass fires.

The pickup truck and motorhome were towed into town; we trust that the driver made it home safely later that night. And we are deeply grateful that we are able to continue using our church building after June 20, 2021.

Some final thank-you's: the vehicle fire occurred just about where the church mailbox is located, and the mailbox got so hot that it no longer closed properly. Many thanks to Bruce Carrington for finding us a new one and installing it, and many thanks to Carl Carter for sweeping up pieces of broken glass and molten metal from the road.

Meanwhile at **Tomales Church**, Sharon and Eric Knudsen got back in touch with Coy Brown Painting, the company that had painted the outside of the church sanctuary last fall; **we needed a bit of follow-up and touch-up of the paint job.** Here is what Sharon wrote on June 30:

Yesterday [June 29] Coy Brown Painting sent out a guy to fix and touch up the flaking spots on the church. We showed him the [southeast] corner, downspout, spots on the north side, another spot on the south side, and also asked him to clean up the marks left by the Christmas wreaths on the doors. When we went up to put the paint and ladders away, we were pleased with the results. We couldn't locate exactly where the spots were on the north side, and the corner and the down spout looks great.

Many thanks to the dedicated craftsmen at Coy Brown Painting, and many thanks to Sharon and Eric Knudsen for overseeing this task.

A big thank-you to Two Rock member Bruce Carrington, who has begun to **custom-build a couple of wall cabinets** for the hallway at Tomales Church.
